Nationally homologated cars may participate in the African Rally Championship rallies when they fit into a national group/class of the organising country, without eligibility to score Championship points.

Art. 4.6 Entry fee refunds

The entry fee shall be refunded in full

- if the event does not take place
- to teams whose entry application is rejected

The organiser may partially refund entry fees if a competitor cannot take part in the event due to a duly proved case of force majeure.

Art. 5 Insurance Cover

MSA Policy No BL000000144

The cost of entry fees includes the premium to insure Motorsport South Africa and its respective members against third party public liability risks, whilst competing in such parts of the Rally on private lands or roads. The limits of cover provided under this Policy is R50 million covering any one incident or accident. However, in the case of spread of fire, this is limited to an annual aggregate amount of R25 Million and that an excess of the first R100,000.00 be payable of any claim. For further details, please revert to the policy wording.

Cover applies only while competing on the event as per MSA policy. Competitors enter and compete at their own risk. The Organizing Clubs and officials decline liability in any incident/ accident caused by or to competitors and their vehicles during the whole duration of the event. Entrants and competitors will have no claim against the organizers, sponsors or landowners of private property arising out of the act or default of or by them, their staff or officials before, during or after the rally.

Art. 6 Advertising and Identification

See Appendix 4 of these SR “Decals and positioning of supplementary advertising”.

The organiser will provide each crew with the number identification, which must be affixed to their car.

Any advertising within this identification is obligatory and may not be refused by the competitors. No modifications to these panels are allowed.

The competition numbers, rally plates and advertising material will be checked and/or affixed to the cars before scrutineering.

Space for the Organizers’ Optional advertising must be reserved on the car unless the higher fee is paid.

Identification numbers – Plates

The Organizers will supply foreign competitors with competition numbers and two (2) class plates, one for each front door. If any number is lost during the event it may result in a penalty of R500.00.

Local competitors must provide their own competition numbers.

DRIVER’S AND CO-DRIVER’S NAMES

REAR SIDE WINDOWS

The first initial(s) and surname of the driver and the co-driver, followed by the national flags of the country of the ASN from which they have obtained their licences, must appear on the rear side window on both sides of the car, adjacent to the competition number. The names must be:

- In white Helvetica.
- In upper case for the initial(s) and first letter of each name with the remainder in lower case. - 6 cm high and with a stroke width of 1.0 cm.

The driver’s name shall be the upper name on both sides of the car.

Two front door panels measuring 67 cm wide by 17 cm high including a 1 cm white surround. Each of these panels shall comprise a matt black competition number box which shall always be at the front of the panel. Numerals will be fluorescent yellow (PMS 803), 14 cm high and with a stroke width of 2 cm. The remainder of this door panel is reserved for the organiser.

Each panel shall be placed horizontally at the leading edge of each front door, with the number at the front. The top of the plate shall be between 7 cm and 10 cm below the lower limit of the window.

No signage, other than the colour scheme of the car, shall be placed within 10 cm of this panel. One rear window panel measuring a maximum of 30 cm wide and 10 cm high shall be positioned at the bottom in the centre of the rear window. An adjacent area of 15 cm x 15 cm shall contain a fluorescent orange (PMS 804) 14 cm high competition number on a clear background. This number may be reflective and must be visible from the rear at eye level.

FRONT DOOR PANELS

SIDE WINDOWS

Two numbers for each rear side window which shall be 20 cm high with a stroke width 25 mm, coloured fluorescent orange (PMS 804), and may be reflective.

These numbers shall be placed on the rear side windows adjacent to the crew's name.

ROOF PANEL

One roof panel, 50 cm wide by 52 cm high, to be placed on the roof with the top towards the front of the car. A matt black competition number, 5 cm wide by 28 cm high, will be displayed on a matt white background 50 cm wide by 38 cm high.

Any organiser advertising must fit into an area of the same width (50 cm) and 14 cm high (or 2 x 7 cm high), situated above and/or below the numbers.

It is at the organisers' discretion to distribute roof panels to the competitors.

FRONT PLATE

One plate fitting into a rectangle 43 cm wide by 21.5 cm high which shall include at least the competition number and full name of the rally.

RESTRICTIONS ON ADVERTISING

Competitors are allowed to affix any kind of advertising to their cars, provided that:

- It is authorised by the national laws and the FIA regulations.
- It is not likely to give offence.
- It is not political or religious in nature.
- It respects the regulations on competition numbers.
- It does not interfere with the crew's vision through the windows.
- It complies with the provisions of Article 10.6.2 of the Code.

The name of an automobile manufacturer may not be associated with the name of a rally or appear in the organiser's compulsory advertising spaces.

The text of any obligatory organiser advertising must be clearly indicated in the supplementary regulations, or in an official bulletin before the close of entries for the rally.

Art. 6.1 **Obligatory organiser's advertising**

Rally plate:

TRACN4 Rally of South Africa

The organiser will provide each crew with the number identification (67x17cm), which must be affixed to their car in the stated positions prior to scrutineering. Each panel shall be placed horizontally at the leading edge of each front door, with the number at the front. The top of the plate shall be between 7 cm and 10 cm below the lower limit of the window. **It is not allowed to cut the panel.**

Art. 6.2 Optional organiser's advertising

The organiser may require competitors to carry optional advertising. If a competitor declines this advertising the entry fee may not be more than doubled. In any case this additional charge is limited to €2,000.

No additional fee for optional advertising referring to a make of automobile, tyres, fuel or lubricant may be imposed on a competitor if the competitor refuses such advertising.

Competitors who accept the organiser's optional advertising as specified in the supplementary regulations must reserve space for it. No modification of the advertising is allowed.

The organiser's optional advertising must be clearly indicated in the supplementary regulations. If the optional advertising is published in a bulletin, and should there be conflicts with the competitor's advertising, the competitor may refuse such optional advertising without paying any extra fee.

CHAMPIONSHIPS IDENTIFICATION AND ADVERTISING

The promoter of a Championship (if applicable) may have additional advertising requirements. The following areas are reserved for a Championship Promoter (if any) to apply championship identification and advertising by means of sticker sets:

- A space (15 cm high and the full width of the windscreen), below the existing 15 cm high reservation for Competitors at the top of the windscreen, on condition that it complies with the national laws of the country of the rally.
- A space 6 cm high and 67 cm wide immediately below the front door panel described in Article 27.2.1.
- A space up to 10 cm high and 20 cm wide on the dashboard of the car and within view of the on-board Camera of the Championship Promoter.
- Any advertising within the championship identification must comply with Articles 29.1 and 29.2 of Re 2021 Regional Rally Sporting Regulations

Art. 7 Tyres

Art. 7.1 Regulations regarding tyres which may be used during the rally

The use of slick, studded or spiked tyres is prohibited under pain of exclusion.

Drivers must use moulded tyres, in accordance with the FIA rules, refer to Art 13.1.2 of the 2021 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations In addition, in accordance with the FIA Sporting Regional Rallies Championships Regulations concerning the use of tyres, the quantity of tyres that may be used is open

See Art. 13 of the FIA RRSR (tyres and wheels).

APPLICABLE FOR SA NATIONAL ENTRANTS ONLY Tyres specified for use during the rally.

To be eligible for scoring in the SA National Rally Championship, only the approved MRF controlled tyres may be used as specified in the 2021 NRC SSR's Art 7.4

NRC 1 – 7.4.1, NRC 2 - 7.4.2, NRC 3 – 7.4.3, NRC 4 – 7.4.4, NRC 5 - 7.4.5

Art. 7.2 Tyres for use on reconnaissance

Tyres for use on reconnaissance are free.

Art. 7.3 National laws or special requirements

Other than on special stages all National Traffic laws will apply.

Art. 8 Fuel

All type of fuel must follow Appendix J Art. 252.9. (RRSR Art. 62).

The use of Avgas is permitted for competitors not entering the SA Championship.

Competitors are entirely responsible for providing and distributing their own fuel throughout the event.

SA Championship competitors must comply with SSR 184.

Art. 8.1 Ordering procedure

Not applicable

Art. 8.2 Closing date for ordering fuel

Not applicable

Art. 9 Reconnaissance of Special Stages

Reconnaissance will be according to FIA RRSR Art. 35.1. Only ONE pass reconnaissance allowed. The schedule for the reconnaissance is published in Appendix 2 of these Supplementary Regulations.

Art. 9.1 Registration procedure

Recce cars need not be registered.

Each car must be identified with a reconnaissance car number supplied by the organiser. Rally cars used in the event may not be used for reconnaissance.

Art. 9.2 Specific regulations

During reconnaissance, all national traffic regulations must be followed, including but not limited to the speed limits. The speed limit is a maximum speed of 60kph on gravel roads. Please note that the Special Stages will be closed to public traffic during reconnaissance. The organizer may reduce the allowed speed individually by marking the areas in the road book and along the route. Speeding during reconnaissance and / or shakedown will be penalised according to FIA RRSR Article 34.2.

More than one crew may share a vehicle during reconnaissance subject to COVID -19 protocols. This may not result in any competitor doing more than a single pass. ID or passport numbers may be scanned at the start and end of each stage.

Art. 9.3 Collection of speed control checking devices

All reconnaissance cars must be equipped with a speed control checking device – C-track device. This device can be collected according to the programme in chronological order (SR Art. 3)

Art. 10 Administrative checks

Art. 10.1 Documents to be presented:

To keep the time required for the administrative checks to the necessary minimum, make sure to bring and present the following documents:

- Competitors' licence
- Driver's and co-driver's competition licences
- Driver's and co-driver's ID cards/passports
- Driver's and co-driver's valid driving licences
- ASN authorisation for foreign competitors (if required)
- Completion of all details on the entry form
- Car registration papers – Foreign competitors
- Car insurance certificate – Foreign competitors
- Car license documents – Foreign competitors
- Medical Insurance
- Medical Card – FIA
- Duly completed Medical Questionnaire from the website www.sarallying.co.za
- SA Covid-19 Documents if needed – to be advised.
- **On event contactable South African cellular numbers, for emergency purposes, for both crew members and the service and/or team manager – complete on Entry Form.**
- **A representative from the team may do the administrative checks but all drivers and co-drivers must be present at drivers' briefing.**

Art. 11 Scrutineering, Sealing and Marking

Art. 11.1 Scrutineering, venue and timetable

Cars may be presented at scrutineering by a representative of the team. See programme (SR Art. 3)

Venue and timetable will be communicated to entrants and published in Bulletin 1.

Art. 11.1.1 Scrutineering, mandatory documents

- Cars' complete certified homologation
- SOS / OK board (DIN A3 format)
- Technical Passport
- A copy of the car's registration certificate must be presented
- It is the competitor's responsibility to obtain a signed scrutineering sticker from the scrutineers. NO car will be allowed to start without this signed scrutineering sticker.
- The nominal compression ratio of all R2 cars may be checked at Scrutineering. Technical crews are requested to have any required tools, etc available to expedite the process.

For each car of the **FIA Priority Drivers**, one spare gearbox and one set of spare differentials (front and/or centre and/or rear) may be used in each rally. These spare components and those fitted to the car will be marked/sealed at initial scrutineering. These cars must have their sump guards removed for sealing of gearboxes and differentials and be kept with the car for the purpose of weighting.

The installation of the tracking system will be checked at scrutineering.

Art. 11.1.2 Timetable for scrutineering

Venue and timetable will be communicated directly to entrants and also published in Bulletin 1.

Art. 11.4 Drivers' safety equipment

All items of clothing including helmets and FHR (Front Head Restraint) intended to be used, eg. HANS devices must be presented for scrutineering. Approved neck restraints and flame-resistant clothing will be checked at scrutineering.

They shall be checked for compliance with Appendix L, Chapter III.

Art. 11.5 Noise level

Noise level may be checked. The maximum noise level admitted is 94dB (A) to 103dB (A) (Appendix J Art 252.3.6) SSR 193 Article 8

Art. 11.6 Special national requirements

SA Championship Entrants must comply with the SA Championship Regulations.

Art. 11.7 Installation of the safety tracking system

All competitors must make provision in their cars (brackets correctly secured) for the installation of a Safety Tracking System (C-Track devices). Installation and operating instructions can be downloaded from www.sarally.co.za. The correct functioning and installation of the equipment will be checked at scrutineering. Crews are instructed to arrive at scrutineering fifteen (15) minutes earlier than their allocated scrutineering time to allow for the installation of the C-Track device. Please ensure that the mounting points are strictly as per the SSR's.

For rallies counting towards the FIA African Rally Championship, the use of a safety tracking system is obligatory.

Art.12 Other procedures and regulations

Art. 12.1 Ceremonial start procedures and order

Art. 12.2 Electronic start procedure

Rallytime clocks are in use and will be clearly visible to the crew. The starting time will be displayed as a countdown clock, starting from 59 seconds with the competitor starting on zero seconds. The cars will take their place on the starting line following the marshal's instructions. Results for Special Stages will be measured to the tenth of a second.

Art. 12.3 Finish procedures

The competition part of the rally ends at the final TC – Parc Ferme IN

Art. 12.4 Permitted early check-in

Crews may report before their due time at the following time controls:

- Parc Ferme IN at the end of Day 1.
- Parc Ferme IN at the end of Day 2.
- Crews must nominate their correct clock-in time provided they are early.

Art. 12.5 Super Special Stage, regulations and order

Art. 12.6 Special procedures and activities

Art. 12.6.1 Availability of participants

Participants who park their vehicles in the Parc Fermé upon passing the finish line, must remain available by phone (mobile) until the final classification have been posted.

Art. 12.6.2 Classification

The official final classification will not be distributed after the event. The final classification will

be published on the website on the Digital Notice Board www.sarallying.co.za

Art. 12.7 Official time used during the rally

Official time throughout the entire rally will be GMT+2 as per GPS Standard Time and a master clock will be on display at the administrative checking.

Art.12.8 Safety Plan

A detailed Safety Plan will be published beforehand for crews to print and have available in their vehicles on the event. Foreign competitors will be issued with a copy.

Art.12.9 Testing

Testing – SA Competitors also refer to SSR193 Article 8.2.2

Any crew testing within the vicinity of the rally area should seek approval of the Clerk of the Course as they may be barred from participating in the event when within 150 kilometres from Rally HQ.

Art.12.10 Road Books

To save costs and the environment, traditional Road Books will not be distributed to local ASN competitors. Competitors may download the road books from the website www.sarally.co.za if they should require a copy. All liaison sections will be published beforehand for competitors to download. All officials and foreign competitors will be able to collect a copy of the complete Road Books from the Rally Secretary at Rally HQ.

Art. 12.11 Shakedown Stage

A Shakedown Stage may operate on Thursday, 25th November 13:00 and 17:00. Full detail at Documentation. Crews intending to do the Shakedown Stage must have completed documentation to qualify. All safety requirements as for a Special Stage will apply and basic safety checks will be carried out by the Technical Delegate.

Art.12.12 Qualifying Stage / Free Practice

12.12.1 General

A Free Practice / Qualifying Stage will be organised for all ARC eligible drivers, in order to establish the rally start order for the first leg.

All ARC eligible drivers must participate in Qualifying.

The Free Practice / Qualifying stage shall:

- be run as if it were a stage run during the rally and include all the appropriate safety measures,
- form part of the rally programme, but not part of the rally results,
- be representative of the rally, – ideally be of a distance between 3 km and 5 km.

12.12.2 Running of Free Practice

A Free Practice stage will be organised with the purpose of being both a media and promotional opportunity and for competitors to trial their cars.

The eligible drivers may complete a maximum of 2 passages of practice within the timeframe specified by the organisers.

12.12.3 Breakdown during Free Practice

A competitor whose car is unable to complete the Free Practice stage will be required to wait for the organisers to transport the car to the end of the stage after the Free Practice session has finished.

12.12.4 Disclaimer

Any passenger on board the car during Free Practice who is not entered for the rally must have signed a disclaimer provided by the organiser.

12.12.5 Running of the Qualifying Stage

After the 2 passages allowed for practice, eligible drivers will start the Qualifying stage in the order of the current African Rally Championship standings for Drivers with a 2-minute interval between each car.

The driver and co-driver entered must be on board the car throughout the Qualifying Stage.

The Stewards shall decide the order of drivers who are not been classified in the African Rally Championship for Drivers.

A starting list will be published at a time indicated in the rally Supplementary Regulations. The procedures stipulated for the start of a special stage will apply.

In the event of a dead heat in Qualifying, the competitors concerned will be classified in the order of their start positions in the Qualifying Stage.

If permitted in the Supplementary Regulations of the rally, Priority drivers may also participate in the Shakedown stage.

12.12.6 Non-participation or breakdown during the Qualifying Stage

Any car which breaks down during the Qualifying stage or during the following road section will be transported to the parc fermé by the organisers once the Qualifying stage has finished.

Any driver who does not participate or does not correctly complete the Qualifying stage will be seeded last on the start list, amongst the ARC eligible drivers. If more than one driver does not complete the stage, start positions will be chosen in the order of the starting list for the Qualifying stage.

12.12.7 Attribution of Starting Positions

The competitors will choose their start position for the rally according to the results of the Qualifying stage.

The fastest driver will choose his position first, then the second, followed by the third etc. Cars will be grouped in no more than 5 cars of similar performance.

Any driver who did not / does not arrive on time to choose his position will automatically choose his position last.

The location and time of day of this procedure must be specified in the rally Supplementary Regulations.

Art. 13 Identification of officials

All Officials, Organizers, Sponsors, Team managers, service crews and Competitors will be issued with either and/or ID Cards and Passes for the event.

Art. 14 Prizes

All member of the crews must be present at the podium ceremony / prize-giving. Crews who are not present may forfeit their prizes, however the final results will not be modified.

ARC list of Prizes and Cups –

The crews will be awarded following the Overall results:

- 2021 FIA African Rally Championship for Drivers and Co-drivers
- FIA ARC 2 Championship for Drivers and Co-Drivers
- FIA ARC 3 Championship for Drivers and CO-Drivers
- FIA ARC junior Championship for Drivers
- All finishers may receive a finishers' award
- All competitors who had started the event, will receive a commemorative plate or certificate

SA National & Regional Championships Prizes and awards –

- Overall winners - 1st, 2nd, 3rd (Driver & Co-driver)
- Classes NRC1 to NRC5 – 1st, 2nd, 3rd (Driver & Co-driver)
- Classes NR1 to NR4 – 1st, 2nd, 3rd (Driver & Co-driver)
- All finishers may receive a finishers' award

Art. 15 Final checks / Protests / Appeals

Art. 15.1 Final Checks

Time and location: see programme (SR. Art. 3)

Any teams required to undergo final checks must immediately follow the instruction of the marshals in charge, even if this prevents them from proceeding to one or more time controls (TC). The complete original FIA homologation form and other necessary certifications must be available for final checks. For national cars the corresponding original ASN documents must be available.

Art.15.2 Protest deposit

Refer SSR 193.24 and GCR's 197 to 224 of the 2021 MSA Handbook and must be lodged in accordance with Art 13, 14 and 15 of the FIA International Sporting Code. Protest Fee is €1,000

The protest deposit is: **EUR 1.000**

If a protest requires the dismantling and re-assembly of a clearly defined part of the car, any additional deposit will be specified by the Stewards upon a proposal of the Chief Scrutineer.

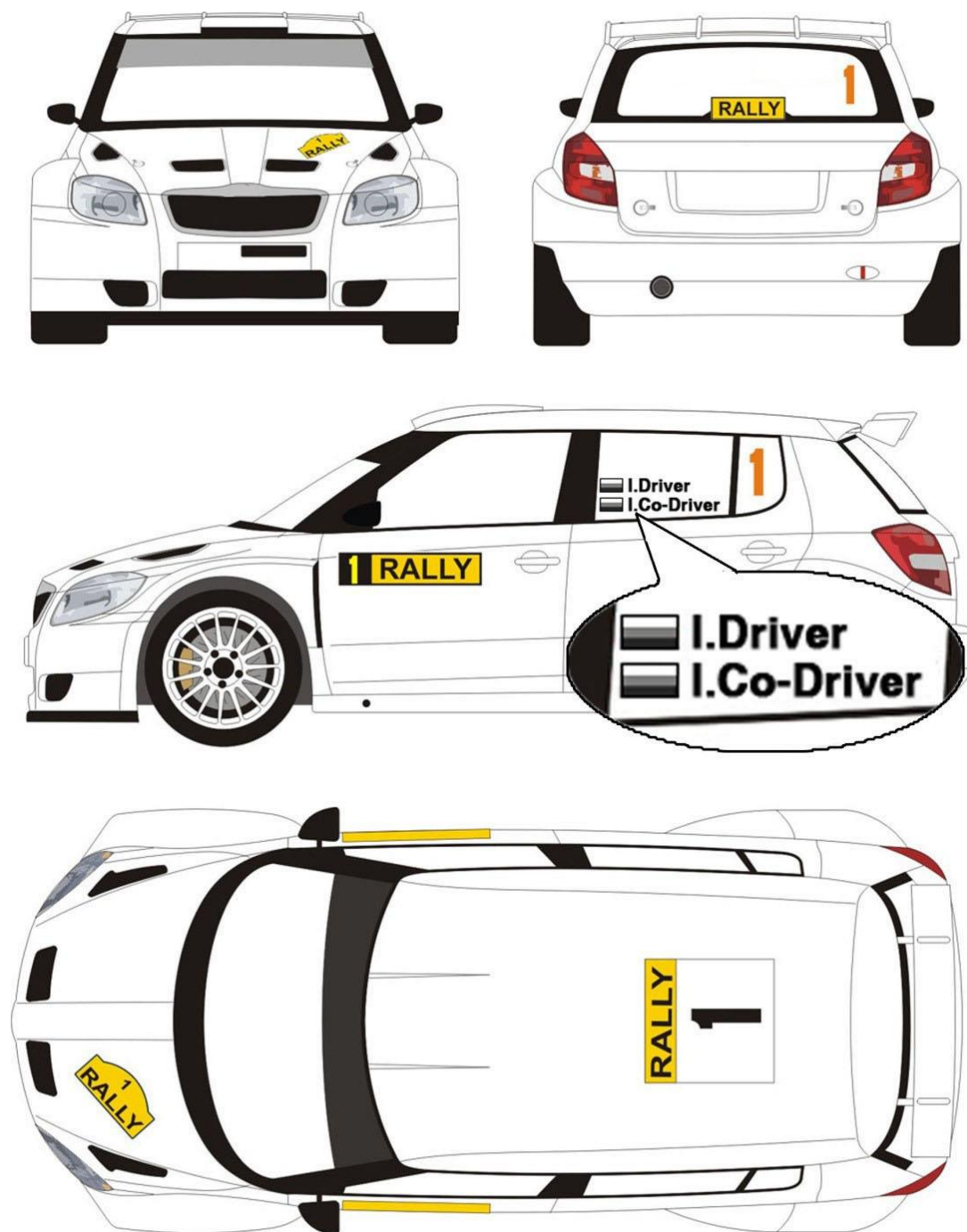

All competitors are reminded of Appendix L of the FIA International Sporting Code, in particular its -

Chapter III - Drivers' Equipment.

Helmets (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 1)

All crews must wear crash helmets homologated to one of the following FIA standards:

- 8858-2002 or 8858-2010 (Technical List N°41),
- 8859-2015 (Technical List N°49),
- 8860-2004 or 8860-2010 (Technical List N°33), or
- 8860-2018 or 8860-2018-ABP (Technical List N°69)

Frontal Head Restraint (FHR, Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3)

All crews must use FIA approved FHR systems homologated to FIA standard 8858.

Approved FHRs, anchorages and tethers are listed in Technical List N° 29.

See also helmet compatibility chart in Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3.3.

Flame-resistant clothing (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2)

All drivers and co-drivers must wear overalls as well as gloves (optional for co-drivers), long underwear, a balaclava, socks and shoes homologated to the FIA 8856-2000 standard (Technical List N°27) or 8856-2018 (Technical List N° 74). Please pay special attention to the prescriptions of Art. 2 concerning embroidery and printing on flame-resistant clothing (manufacturer certificates etc.) **as well as concerning the correct wearing of the clothing elements! See also Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, Article 53.1.**

Biometric Devices (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2.1)

Drivers may wear a device to collect biometric data during racing.

- If the biometric device is integrated into a protective garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856, the garment shall be homologated to FIA Standards 8856 and 8868-2018.
- If the biometric device is a stand-alone device, then the device must be homologated to FIA Standard 8868-2018 only. This device must be worn in addition to the garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856.

Wearing of jewellery (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 5)














The wearing of jewellery in the form of body piercing or metal neck chains is prohibited during the competition and may therefore be checked before the start.
