On event, contactable cell phone numbers for both crew members and the Service Manager must be provided, in case of Assistance required by a crew on the event.

19. SCRUTINEERING, SEALING AND MARKING

- Physical Scrutineering activities will be carried out by the MSA Scrutineer/s and/or appointed technical delegates and/or assistants, and/or additional random technical inspections may be carried out on instruction by the Clerk of Course at any time during the event for compliance and safety.
- The Self Scrutineering form will need to be completed, Signed and submitted electronically to the Rally Secretary no later than Wednesday, 7th March 2023.
- Please ensure all safety equipment is compliant to the GCR's and SSR's.
- By signing the Self Scrutineering form, you declare that your vehicle meets all the GCR's & SSR requirements and accept that action will be taken should any discrepancies arise during the competition.
- Any technical inspections (whether as a result of protest or not) must be held at a later date with the part/s in question properly sealed and stored for safe keeping.

20. START PROCEDURES

- Start order and Intervals
 - A. Drivers Briefing will be done in the oval near Documentation at 8h00 on Saturday, 11th March. Both Crew members are to attend the drivers' briefing.
 - B. Starting positions will be determined by the Clerk of the Course.
 - C. 2-minute START intervals will be applicable between cars. Extra time gaps may be applied between cars if deemed necessary by the Clerk of the Course.

The Clerk of the Course reserves the right to make changes to the starting position in the interest of safety.

21. RECONNAISSANCE

NO Reconnaissance (known also as RECCE) will be allowed on any MSA Regional event and no regional team will be allowed to recce on an event on the same date as a National Rally, by reasons:

1. Reduces costs to competitors
2. Reduces unnecessary late start times of events
3. Retains and uphold condition of stages by not allowing unnecessary traffic / heavier vehicles reconnaissance (critical during rainy seasons) and thereby maintaining stages for future usage and eliminate unnecessary spending of repeated grading.
4. Improves safety by reducing fatigue caused by recce time and to reduce risk of further incidents and accidents.
5. Improves driver and co-driver in car communication, safety, concentration/focus and skill levels
6. Levelling the playing field of the in car team, promoting co-driver value system

22. OTHER PROCEDURES

- Safety Plan
- A detailed safety plan will be published beforehand for crews to print and have available on the event in their vehicles. Stage Road Book
To save costs and the environment, traditional road books will not be distributed to competitors. All officials will have a copy of the road book and competitors may download them directly from www.sarally.co.za if they should require a copy. All liaison sections will be published beforehand for competitors to download.
THE ROAD BOOK TAKES PREFERENCE OVER SAFETY NOTES AND ANY OTHER NAVIGATIONAL AIDS – Refer SSR 193.10.1.1
- Official Notice Board
The location of the official notice board will be the same as the Rally HQ Willem Prinsloo Museum Auditorium, **as well as VIRTUALLY on www.sarally.co.za and the Events WhatsApp Group.**
- The NRC Operated Rallytime 3 GPS RALLY CLOCKS will be used during the rally for official stage time recording. Back up clocks will be in place at the Flying Finish, which will be used if the primary system should fail.
Rallytime clocks are in use. The control official will enter the SSS time into the clock which will then display by means of a digital read out counting down from 59 seconds with the competitor starting on zero seconds.
Should Rallytime clocks not be in use, or fail before the SSS time, the control official will count the competitor down by appropriate hand signals to indicate the start.
Results for special stages will be measured to 1/10 of a second.
Jump Start beams will operate at all starts.
- Penalties
Refer GCR's 172 to 196 of the MSA General Competition Rules.
- Protests and Appeals
Refer SSR 193(23) and GCR's 197 to 224 of the MSA General Competition Rules.
Protest & Appeal hearings is to be held electronically as far as possible to minimize in-person contact.
- Postponement, Abandonment or Cancellation of the event

- Impossible Times

Refer SSR 193 18.19

Refuel: No dedicated refuel zones will be available. Please Refuel in the Service Park. Take all precautionary measures when working with fuel.

- **Environmental mats are required and compulsory and will be checked during scrutineering and in parc ferme, non compliance could lead to exclusion.** Applicable SSR's will be applied accordingly.

Fire extinguishers are to be visible and easily accessible as per SSR 193.25.3.8. (Competitors Service Area)

23. SERVICE CREWS

- As service crews are connected with the rally, competitors are asked to ensure their crews obey all traffic regulations, especially in built-up areas. Refer SSRs 193.25.2.1 and SSR 173.

A. Service is only permitted :In designated service areas.

B. Any area so designated by the Clerk of the Course and as indicated on the route schedule. Competitors and their Service Crews are advised to familiarize themselves with MSA Environmental Code in the current MSA Handbook.

C. A Team will consist of a Driver, a Co-Driver and Technical Personnel

24. JUDGES OF FACT: Refer GCR 162

Judges of fact will be present in all stages/Any deviation (deliberate or mistakenly) from any part of the route (Special stage or Open Section) will and could lead to total exclusion from rally and not necessary a time penalty. Please use GPS or google maps or similar applications on open sections only if totally lost and report on event whatsapp group. Additional Judges of Fact may be appointed to observe certain stages to eliminate any possible shortcutting of the route. Any Official / Competitor on the event will act as judge of fact and report to the Clerk of the Course any deviation or shortcutting of the route – SSR 193 8.2.13.

25. ALCOHOL

It is forbidden for **any competitor their crew or any race official** to consume alcohol at any time on the date of the event, prior to start of the event or while taking part in an event or in the period between the competitor completing the event and lodging an official protest. (GCR118).

26. TIMECARDS AND INCIDENT REPORT FORMS

A crew breaking down in a stage must please take note that it is prohibited to remove their car before the Sweep Car has reported their withdrawal from the event. A fully completed Incident Report has to be submitted to Rally HQ Electronically and Timecards (if completely retiring) handed in at the Service Park marshal.

A link to the Electronic Incident Report is posted on the Competitors' Whatsapp Group.

SSR 193.16 refers. A penalty may be imposed on the crew who does not hand in their Timecards, and Incident Report Form after the withdrawal from the event or completion of the event.

27. ABANDONED CARS

No cars are to be left in a stage unattended. One or both crew members must remain with the car until it is collected by the service crew or by other means. A penalty of R500.00 may be imposed on any crew who contravenes this clause. (SSR 193 18.20)

28. SUPER RALLY

Refer to SSR 193.26

Super Rally does not apply to this event. Any teams entered in the regional event and requires a different restart at any time must obtain approval from the Clerk of Course. A fine or total exclusion from results may be imposed on Teams found contravening this.

29. UNREALISTIC STAGE TIMES

The Clerk of the Course may, at his sole discretion, adjust any stage time he considers unrealistic and the offending crew will be afforded a time, 10 sec/km or part thereof slower than the fastest car in the same class, or if the offending crew is the only car in the class, 10 sec/km or part thereof slower than the fastest crew in the next class lower

30. PRIZES

ONE EVENT LICENSES DO NOT QUALIFY FOR AWARDS AND POINTS

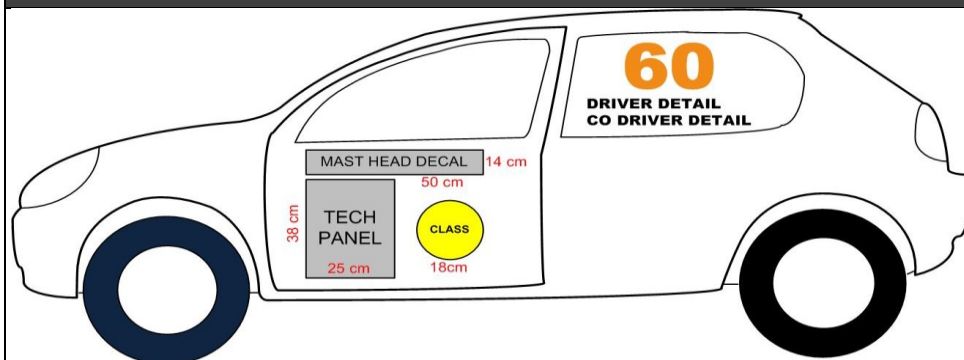

36. APPENDIX 2

- **Medical Aid Boards**

- All cars must carry a Medical Aid Board, which must be used according to the following instructions:

- **Description of Board and Availability**

The board will be made of white plastic 3mm thick, 415mm in length and 360mm in width. On one side there will be a red cross and on the other side a letter "O" or "OK" in reflective green. These boards are available from Rally Head Quarters. No other boards, unless identical to boards available from Rally Head Quarters, will be acceptable.

- **Carrying of Boards in Rally Cars**

Boards must be properly secured to the inside passenger compartment or be secured together with the warning triangle to avoid loss, damage or injury in the event of an accident. They must be easily accessible to the driver and/or co-driver as they vacate their seats in the event of an accident. The position and securing of the board will be checked by Scrutineers prior to the start of the event and no rally car will be allowed to start an event without the board being carried and secured in the competing vehicle in an approved manner.

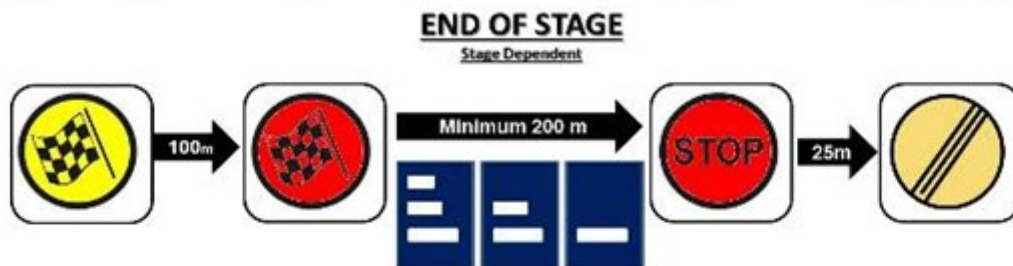
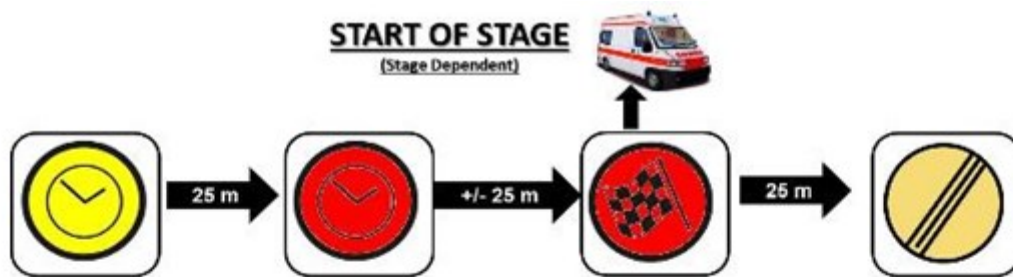
- **Use of board following an Accident**

Should any competitor stop due to an accident whilst on the route being used for the event, the board together with a warning triangle must be displayed. Should medical assistance be required the board must be displayed in such a manner that the red cross is clearly visible to all approaching competitors, preferably at eye level. Care must be exercised to ensure that the correct side of the board is displayed to oncoming competitors. While the board is displayed in this manner the first competitor arriving on the scene shall stop and render assistance. Should a competitor happen upon a scene of an accident without the board being displayed it must be assumed that the injuries are of such a nature that the competitors are seriously injured and unable to display the board. Assistance must be immediately rendered. If further assistance from other competitors is required, the crew of the car rendering initial assistance shall display their board showing the red cross. If no additional assistance is required, the green "O" or "OK" shall be displayed with the "O" or "OK" visible to oncoming competitors until the vehicle has been removed. Obviously following an accident where no injuries are involved, the green "O" or "OK" must be displayed for the benefit of other competitors.

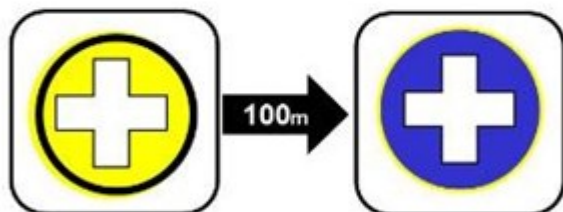
- **Penalties**

Competitors who fail to stop upon arriving at the scene of an accident, where no medical aid board is displayed or where a red cross is displayed, are guilty of contravening motorsport regulations and will be reported to the Stewards for disciplinary action. Competitors not injured following an accident that fail to display green "O" or "OK" shall be subject to disciplinary action being instigated by the Clerk of the Course through the Stewards for the event who in turn may precipitate further action being taken against the offenders by the Rally Organizers.

Misuse of the medical warning boards will be treated as a serious offence and will be dealt with as such.



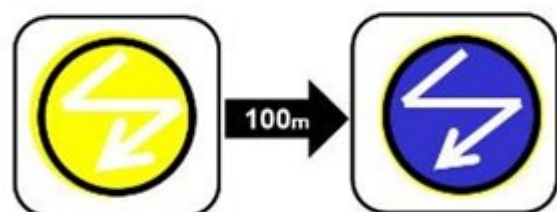
