## 5.2. Service Plates

Every team will be issued with two service plates per entry for access to the service parks. No vehicle whatsoever will be allowed into service parks unless they have a legitimate service decal. Refer SSR 193(12). Vehicles will also not be allowed to enter the premises on the service roads if the above decal has not been attached on the vehicle. NB! Please kindly ensure that you pre-order (R50 each), the number tyre decals you wish to order from your annual allocation for this event. These will be issued at documentation.

## 5.2 Publication of Entry List

The organizers will only publish an entry list, after entries have closed on Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> September 2019. The Entry list will be published on the SARally Facebook page, Northern Regions Stage Rallying Facebook page as well as [www.sarally.co.za](http://www.sarally.co.za) no later than Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> September 2019.

## 6. ADVERTISING

6.1. Organisers Advertising: The Organisers advertising is compulsory to participate in the event. Ref to GCR 246, 247, SSR 168 & SSR 193.10

### 6.2. Rally Plates

Competitor numbers and rally plates must be affixed to the car for scrutineering. These must be visible for the duration of the rally. Details concerning the numbers and rally plates can be found under point 14 below.

## 7. TYRES

7.1. Tyres specified for use during the rally.

Only tyres complying with MSA Regulations may be used during the event.

## 8. ADMINISTRATIVE CHECKS

8.1 A representative from the team may do the Administrative checks, but all drivers and co-drivers must be present at drivers briefing.

8.2 At administrative checks the following documents will be checked, and entry form details verified:





Crews, Entrant's MSA competition licences and Provincial Drivers' licences

Correctness of all other information given on the entry form

Medical questionnaires must be completed beforehand and submitted to the NRC.

- 8.1. **On event contactable cell phone numbers for both crew members and the Service manager must be provided. Take Note, the organisers require a contact number of a service crew member that is present at the event, not a number of a relative in a different town.**

## 9. **SCRUTINEERING, SEALING AND MARKING**

9.1 Scrutineering details will be published in Bulletin 1.

9.2 The Self Scrutineering form will need to be printed and completed before arriving.

9.3 A representative from the team may do the Scrutineering.

Please ensure all safety equipment is presented - Competitors helmets, FIA approved Front Head Restraint (FHR) and flame-resistant clothing will be checked at scrutineering.

9.4 It is the competitor's responsibility to obtain a signed scrutineering sticker from the Scrutineers.

No car will be allowed to start without a signed scrutineering sticker.

## 10. **START PROCEDURES**

10.1 Start order and Intervals as per MSA Standing Supplementary Regulations 193.16

10.2 **Start positions on Day One** will be according to rotation in R2N

10.3 Classic cars and Open Class cars to start behind R2N in combined seeded order

10.4 2 minute intervals will be applied between each category, however extra time gap may be applied between categories for safety

10.5 The Clerk of Course and Stewards may change the starting order on grounds of safety

10.6 **Start positions on Day Two** will be according to the results off day one.

10.7 The Clerk of Course may change the starting order on grounds of safety

## 11. **RECONNAISSANCE**

11.1. Competitors wishing to participate in the Recce, must notify the organisers by no later than **Wednesday, 25<sup>th</sup> September 2019**. Sign on will be at Rally HQ on **Friday 27<sup>th</sup> September 2019**. This must please be indicated on the entry form

11.2. A Recce schedule will be published after close of recce registration.

11.3 Crews will be limited to a single pass of the prescribed route and in a road order sequence as per the schedule.

## 12. **OTHER PROCEDURES**

12.1 Safety Plan

A detailed safety plan will be published beforehand for crews to print and have available on the event in their vehicles.

12.2 Road Books

In order to save costs and the environment, traditional road books will not be distributed to competitors. All officials will have a copy of the road books and competitors may download them directly from [www.sarally.co.za](http://www.sarally.co.za) if they should require a copy. All liaison sections will be published beforehand for competitors to download.

12.3 Official Notice Board

The location of the official notice board will be the same as the Rally HQ.

12.4 Official time used during the rally – GPS time.



### 12.5 Super Rally

Refer SSR 193.25 **Note you may only restart from a new section, with the permission of the Clerk of Course.**

### 12.6 Permitted early check in

Crews may report before their due time at the following time controls:

Parc Ferme IN - At the end of the rally.

Crews must nominate their book in time at these controls.

The official time during the rally will be GPS time (offset to local time).

### 12.7 Event Finish Procedure Crews must follow the instructions of officials during the podium.

Event Finish Procedure Crews must follow the instructions of officials during the podium ceremony. Selected cars will be removed from the Parc Ferme for the ceremony. These cars remain under Parc Ferme conditions and will be observed by marshals until they returned to the Parc Ferme.

### 12.8 Final Parc Ferme

All cars must be removed from the final Parc Ferme once results have become final and the Stewards have authorised the Parc Ferme to be opened.

### 12.9 Penalties

Refer GCR's 172 to 196 of the MSA Handbook.

### 12.10 Protests and Appeals

Refer SSR 193(24) and GCR's 197 to 224 of the MSA Handbook.

### 12.11 Postponement, Abandonment or Cancellation of event

### 12.13 Refuel

No refuel zones. Refuel in Service Park. Environmental mats required. Fire extinguishers per SSR 193.12.3

## 13. SERVICE CREWS

13.1 As service crews are clearly connected with the rally, competitors are asked to ensure their crews obey all traffic regulations, especially in built-up areas. Refer SSRs 193.11 and SSR 173.

13.2 Service is only permitted:

- a) in designated service areas.
- b) Any area so designated by the Clerk of the Course and as indicated on the route schedule. Competitors and their Service Crews are advised to familiarize themselves with MSA Environmental Code in the current MSA Handbook.

## 14. JUDGES OF FACT

Judges of Fact may be appointed to observe certain stages to eliminate any possible short cutting of the route.

## 15. ALCOHOL

It is forbidden for any competitor or members of their crew to consume alcohol while taking part in an event, or in the time period between the competitor completing the event and lodging an official protest. (GCR118).





## **16. TIMECARDS AND INCIDENT REPORT FORMS**

A crew breaking down in a stage must please take note that it is prohibited to remove their car before the Sweep Car has picked up their fully completed Incident Report forms and Timecards (if completely retiring).

SSR 193.17.7 refers. A penalty may be imposed on the crew who does not hand in their Timecards and Incident Report Form after withdrawal of the event or completion of the event.

## **17. ABANDONED CARS**

No cars are to be left in a stage unattended. One or both crew members must remain with the car until it is collected by the service crew or by other means. A penalty of R500.00 may be imposed on any crew who contravenes this clause. The Organizers will have response vehicles on standby to assist with competitor safety at night.

## **18. SUPER RALLY**

Refer to SSR 193. Art 25

The event will be split into sections – Refer to Itinerary for Sections.

## **19. UNREALISTIC STAGE TIMES**

The Clerk of the Course may, at his sole discretion, adjust any stage time he considers unrealistic and the offending crew will be afforded a time, 10 sec/km or part thereof slower than the fastest car in the same class, or if the offending crew is the only car in the class, 10 sec/km or part thereof slower than the fastest crew in the next class lower.

## **20. PRIZES**

### **20.1 Podium Procedure**

A podium celebration will be held as soon as the last car has finished the event. The celebration will be done on provisional results as available at the time. The aim of the podium celebration is for champagne spray and TV and public display purposes. Any disputes should be handled accordingly at HQ as soon as a competitor finishes their race, not publicly at the podium.

The Clerk of the Course reserves the right to change the podium procedures to accommodate timing constraints.

The Order of the Podium will be as follows: Regional top 3

- 1) Classic Class top 3
- 2) Open 2WD Class top 3
- 3) Open 4WD Class top 3
- 4) R2N Class top 3
- 5) TRACN4 NATIONAL RALLY Overall top 3 (if different from class)

**Please note that only Classes with 5 or more entrants will be awarded a 3<sup>rd</sup> Place trophy.**

This will be a champagne spray only, trophies to be handed at the Prize Giving Function.

Podium at the finish of the event at approximately 16h00 on Saturday, followed by a prize giving held at the Willem Prinsloo Agricultural Museum Restaurant.

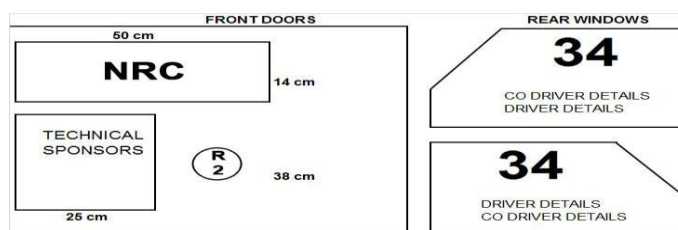

## **Regional Specifics: (Points 23 – 31): REGULATIONS**

Held under the General Competition Rules (GCR's) and Standing Supplementary Regulations (SSR's) of Motorsport South Africa (MSA), including regulations applicable to Rallying, these Supplementary Regulations (SR's) plus further instruction which may be issued by the promoters / organisers / MSA.

### **23. STATUS AND LICENCE REQUIREMENTS**

- 23.1 The **2019 TRACN4 Rally** on Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> September is Round 3 of the 2019 Northern Regions Regional Rally Championship and will count towards the 2019 Northern Regions Regional Championship for Drivers and Co-drivers / Navigators and is open to all drivers / co-drivers / navigators who are domiciled within the area controlled by the MSA Northern Regions Regional Motorsport Committee and who are holders of the appropriate Regional Rally MSA competition licence. No competitor may score in the Northern Regions Championship if he / she is competing in a similar event in another region or if a similar event is available in his / her region and Invited Crews from other Countries.
- 23.2 With the approval of Motorsport South Africa competitors from a neighbouring country may be invited to compete in the event. These competitors will not score points towards the Northern Region Rally Championship.
- 23.3 Licence requirements will be a minimum of a valid MSA Regional competition license for Rally for both crew members.

### **24. SCRUTINEERING**

- 24.1 Scrutineering will be done in the holding area taped off for this purpose and opens at 06h45 on Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> September 2019 and will close at 07h45 on 28<sup>th</sup> September 2019. Cars may be grouped in batches of 10 as per the entry list (SSR 193 15.1.1) Self scrutineering must be completed before presentation of vehicle including Mastheads and / or Technical panels fitted.
- 24.2 Either the driver or co-driver or service crew member must present the vehicle for scrutineering. All crew protective clothing must be presented with the vehicle. 161702/144 Section B clause 9 (b, d & e) as well as clause 12 inclusive.
- 24.3 The following particulars will be checked (SSR 163\* refers):
  - a) Make and model of car (for class)
  - b) Safety Harnesses / belts and crash helmets
  - c) FIA or SANS approved helmets
  - d) Overalls – FIA approved fire resistant racing suit. Refer SSR163.10
  - e) Warning triangles
  - f) Medical Kit
  - g) Medical board
  - h) Mounted fire extinguishers and expiry date (not older than 6 months) (GCR 257 refers).
  - i) Valid car license
  - j) Indicators / tail lights / stop lights / head lights



- k) Competition numbers (SSR 167\* and 193 9.2 – 9.4 refer)
- l) Advertising decals as supplied by the organizers. (SSR 168\* and 193.10)
- m) Environmental Mats – brought to scrutineering. Appendix 11 Environmental Code refers.
- n) Noise appendix 1 (9) refer to Environmental Code available MSA Website [www.motorsport.co.za](http://www.motorsport.co.za)

## **25. SOUND TEST: SILENCING OF VEHICLES (REFER GCR 245)**

Sound Measurement of vehicles may be done at any time during a rally. The Clerk of the Course shall have the right to exclude competitors from further participation in the event when their vehicle exceeds a noise limit of **108dB at half a meter or 99dB at two meters** when tested. Refer to Appendix 1 of the Environmental Code. A further test is a drive by reading with a maximum reading of **96dB**. Failure of either of these tests may entail an exclusion.

## **26. PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE**

Public Liability cover is R50, 000,000.00 (Rand fifty million) with excess of R25, 000.00 payable by the Entrant. Cover applies only while competing on the event as per the MSA policy. Competitors enter and compete at their own risk. The organizing club and officials decline liability in any incident / accident caused by or to competitors and their vehicles during the whole event. Entrants and competitors will have no claim against the organizers or landowners of private property arising out of the act or default of or by them, their servants or officials before, during or after the rally. Motorsport SA Policy No. 19377266/2016

## **27. COMPETITORS ATTENTION IS DRAWN TO THE FOLLOWING CLAUSES OF SSR 193:**

- 27.1 Starting Order - The starting order will be determined by the organizers, taking into consideration the current seeding list and safety.
- 27.2 Delete SSR 193 5.1.3 and replace with:  
A competing crew may replace the vehicle declared on the entry form with another vehicle up to the moment of scrutineering. A new entry form must be completed in full and submitted to the Clerk of the Course.  
No change will be permitted after the start of scrutineering unless agreed upon by the Stewards, but in any case before the publication of the Official Start List.
- 27.3 Delete SSR 193.1.11 and replace with:  
A crew is made up of two persons aboard each car. The two members of the crew will be nominated as a driver and a co-driver. During a special stage, only the nominated driver may be in control of the vehicle. Each member of the crew must possess a valid MSA competition license for rallies. Also see SSR 164.
- 27.4 Pre-Start requirements - SSR 193.15
- 27.5 Route and Road book - SSR 193.8
- 27.6 Controls – SSR 193.18



- 27.7 Regroup controls - SSR 193.18.10
- 27.8 Timing - SSR 193.19 7
- 27.9 Parc Ferme - GCR 252, SSR 180 and SSR 193.20
- 27.10 Results - SSR 193.21
- 27.11 Ties - SSR 193.22
- 27.12 Protests and appeals - SSR 193.24
- 27.13 Identification and publicity - SSR 168\*, SSR 193.10
- 27.14 Littering and excessive noise - For any substantiated instances of littering and excessive noise (GCR 245) and/or reckless driving by competitors, as determined by the Stewards, the following penalties may be applied:
  - a) Exclusion from the final results (SSR 187. a] and 188. c])
  - b) Report to MSA
  - c) Right to refuse entry in future events

The attention of competitors is drawn to SSR 173\* - Traffic Regulations and Speed Restrictions. If contravention of this clause is caused by the service crews, then b) and c) will apply.
- 27.15 In terms of SSR 193.15.2.4 and 193.24.3 the deposit payable shall be not less than R2000.00.
- 27.16 Delete SSR 193 16.3 and replace with the following: Any late arrival ascribed to the crew, at the start of the rally or a leg or of a section or at any Time Control shall be penalized by 5 seconds for every minute or fraction of a minute late. Any crew reporting more than 15 minutes late at the start of the rally shall not be allowed to start.
- 27.17 The use of studded tyres is prohibited in all the rallies of the NR Regional Championships. (SSR 193.13.1).
- 27.18 SSR 193.17.7 refers. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in a penalty of R500.00 being imposed.

## 28 IMPOSSIBLE TIMES SSR 193 19.21

The Clerk of the Course may, at his sole discretion, adjust any stage time he considers unrealistically fast and the offending crew will be afforded a time of 10 sec/km or part thereof slower than the fastest car in the same class, or if the offending crew is the only car in the class of 10 sec/km or part thereof slower than the fastest crew in the next class.

**Competitors are advised to take note of the following clauses:**

**SSR 193.1.1; 193.8.1.1; 193.8.2.3; 193.8.2.6**



## 29 SERVICE CREWS, EXTERNAL SERVICING and REFUELLING

- 29.1 Service crews may NOT under any circumstances try to retrieve a competing vehicle without the prior permission of the Clerk of the Course.  
As service crews are clearly connected with the rally, competitors are asked to ensure that their crews obey all traffic regulations, especially in built-up areas. Refer SSR 193.11, SSR 173\* and SSR 188.c.
- 29.2 Prohibited Service Please note well and refer to SSR 193 12, 1; 2; & 3 “Servicing shall be defined as unrestricted work on a competing car except where limited by the regulations. Prohibited service shall be defined as “the issue or receipt by the crew of any manufactured materials (solid or liquid), spare parts, tools or equipment other than those carried in the competing car.”
- 29.3 Refuelling facilities are permitted in the Centralized Service Area. And ONLY if the correct environmental mat is used.
- 29.4 Service crews are advised to familiarize themselves with the MSA Environmental Code. Available for download from MSA website [www.motorsport.co.za](http://www.motorsport.co.za) item 9 refers.

## 30 JUDGES OF FACT

Judges of Fact may be appointed to observe stages to eliminate any possible short cutting of the route as well as not following the route as per the road book in its entirety and also for littering offences.

## 31 ALCOHOL

It is forbidden for any competitor or official to consume alcohol while taking part in an event, or the time period between the competitor completing the event and lodging an official protest. (GCR118).

## 32 SMOKING

Attention is drawn to GCR 123 & SSR 172 regarding smoking in special stages. Judges of fact may be appointed to observe and report any transgressions. This also applies to open sections on private property and while competitors are waiting at the start of the stages and to any service crews recovering a car.

## 33 ENVIRONMENTAL CODE

Competitors’ attention is drawn to the MSA Environmental Code:

- The use of environmental Mats during servicing and refuelling is compulsory.
- In particular, the Environmental Officer will check up on: Environmental Mats and the Storage of fuel cans.
- Spillage of fuel, oil, brake fluid, coolant etc. causing ground or water pollution in the Service Area/s or anywhere on private property, which is subject to strict environmental controls.

## 34 HANDING IN OF TIME CARDS

In the event of a crew breaking down in a stage, please note it is prohibited to remove the said car before the sweep car has collected the time card from the crew. Refer to SSR 193.17.7. A penalty of R250 will be imposed on any crew who does not deliver their time card after withdrawal from the event.





- 35 **EARLY ARRIVAL AT FINAL CONTROL**  
No penalty will be incurred for early arrival at the final Time Control. (Stipulate the correct time)
- 36 **EARLY RETIREMENT WHILST ON A STAGE**  
As all the stages are held on private land, no broken-down car is allowed to be left in a stage unattended. One or both crew members must remain with the car until collected by their service crew or other means. (The Stewards shall impose a penalty for not complying SSR 187.2)
- 37 **REGIONAL Super Rally.**  
Super Rally will be permitted on this event in compliance with SSR 25.

## APPENDIX 3

### Medical Aid Boards

All cars must carry a Medical Aid Board, which must be used according to the following instructions:

#### a) Description of Board and Availability

The board will be made of white plastic 3mm thick, 415mm in length and 360mm in width. On one side there will be a red cross and on the other side a letter "O" or "OK" in reflective green. These boards are available from Rally Head Quarters. No other boards, unless identical to boards available from Rally Head Quarters, will be acceptable.

#### b) Carrying of Boards in Rally Cars

Boards must be properly secured to the inside passenger compartment or be secured together with the warning triangle to avoid loss, damage or injury in the event of an accident. They must be easily accessible to the driver and/or co-driver as they vacate their seats in the event of an accident. The position and securing of the board will be checked by Scrutineers prior to the start of the event and no rally car will be allowed to start an event without the board being carried and secured in the competing vehicle in an approved manner.

#### c) Use of board following an Accident

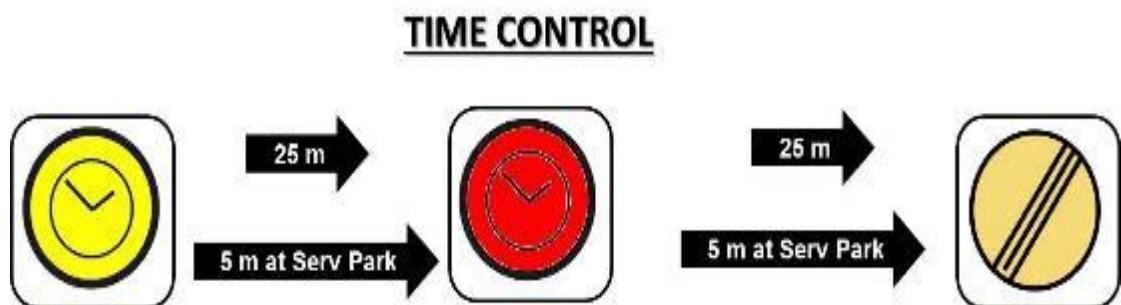
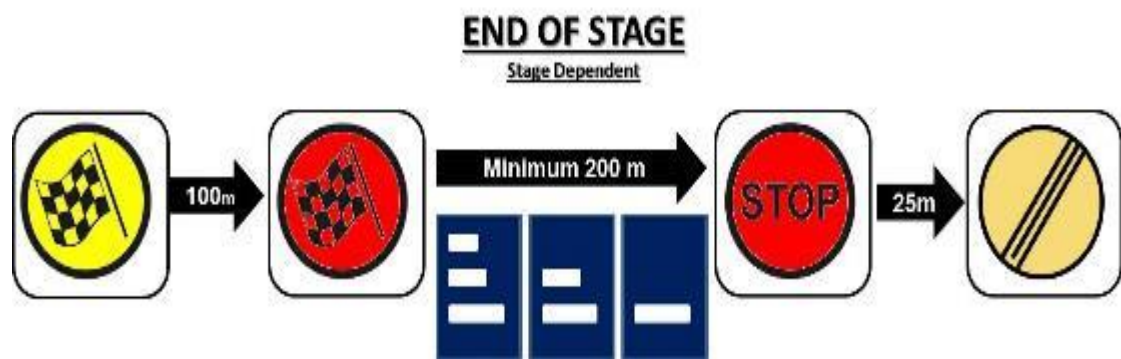
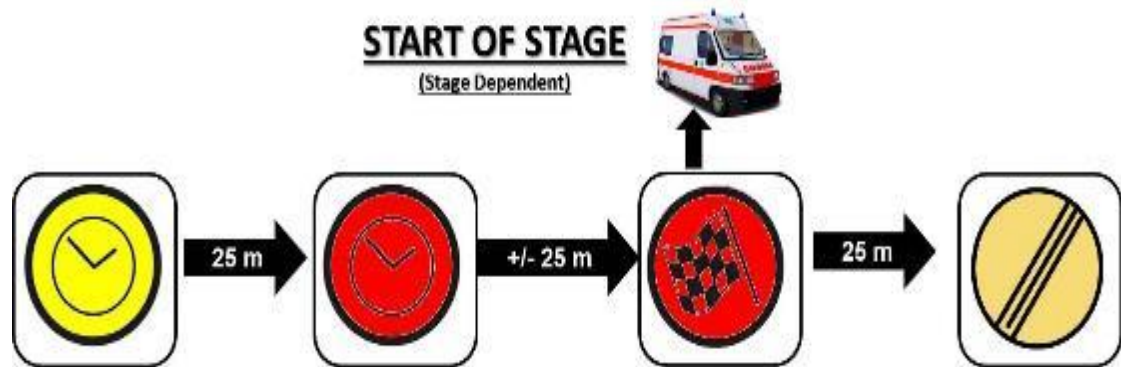
Should any competitor stop due to an accident whilst on the route being used for the event, the board together with a warning triangle must be displayed. Should medical assistance be required the board must be displayed in such a manner that the red cross is clearly visible to all approaching competitors, preferably at eye level. Care must be exercised to ensure that the correct side of the board is displayed to oncoming competitors. While the board is displayed in this manner the first competitor arriving on the scene shall stop and render assistance. Should a competitor happen upon a scene of an accident without the board being displayed it must be assumed that the injuries are of such a nature that the competitors are seriously injured and unable to display the board. Assistance must be immediately rendered. If further assistance from other competitors is required, the crew of the car rendering initial assistance shall display their board showing the red cross. If no additional assistance is required, the green "O" or "OK" shall be displayed with the "O" or "OK" visible to oncoming competitors until the vehicle has been removed. Obviously following an accident where no injuries are involved, the green "O" or "OK" must be displayed for the benefit of other competitors.

#### d) Penalties

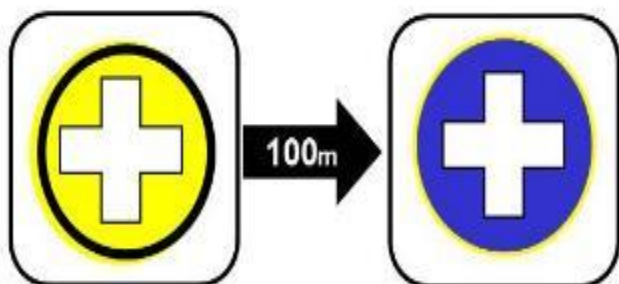
Competitors who fail to stop upon arriving at the scene of an accident, where no medical aid board is displayed or where a red cross is displayed, are guilty of contravening motor sport regulations and will be reported to the Stewards for disciplinary action. Competitors not injured following an accident that fail to display green "O" or "OK" shall be subject to disciplinary action being instigated by the Clerk of the Course through the Stewards for the event who in turn may precipitate further action being taken against the offenders by the Rally Organizers.

e) Misuse of the medical warning boards will be treated as a serious offence and will be dealt with as such





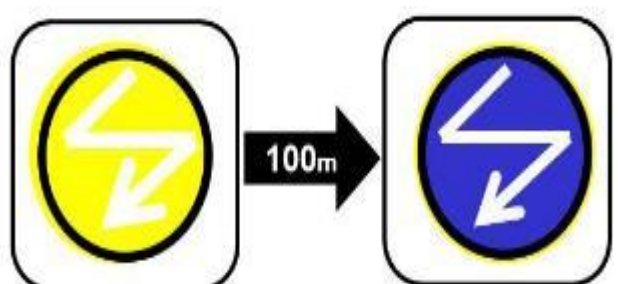
## MEDICAL VEHICLE POINT
